

ACTIVITIES IN ZONAL UNIT ANDHRA PRADESH

1. INCLUSIVE NEIGHBORHOOD CHILDREN'S PARLIAMENT

JMJSSS Children's Parliament promotes participation and leadership among children to do advocacy on child rights. They come together, learn together, discuss together and act together fortnight on issues of children in the village for social change.

Accomplishments:-

On the occasion of Child rights week from 5th to 20th November 2020 JMJ Children's Parliament joined for The National Inclusive Children's Parliament organized with a theme 'we are climate worriers' by PRATYeK on a virtual Platform telecasted from the Indian Parliament New Delhi in which Mr. Venkaiah Naidu, Vice-President of India and Ms. Smriti Irani, Minister of Women & Child Welfare were the main chief guests of the day.



On Oct 11th 2020, JMJSSS celebrated **National Girl Child Day** in Ambedkar Children's Parliament in Nambur. Due to COVID-19 lockdown period very less children participated. Hence, coordinator explained about the importance of the day and the Girls Participated meaningfully.



Children's Day: On 14th November 2020, the celebration of Jawaharlal Nehru's Birthday was conmerated by JMJSSS in Children Parliaments. 24 members participated and conducted motivational games which led to active participation and ended with a take home message.



Science Fair: on 28th February 2021 JMJSSS conducted with the collaboration of APTA-Guntur Science faire at Zilla Parishad High School in Sekuru, Guntur District. The chief guest IRS officer & Asst. Commissioner of Customs Dept. – B.Narendra Kumar, VVIT Educational Institution Chairman - V.Vidhyasagar, Jana Vizhnana Vedik Director – P.V.Ramesh participated and The School Principal – K.Narasimha Rao presided over the program. In this school premises every

participant arranged their Science Exhibition Stalls for explaining their projects. Guests appreciated according with Certificates and encouraged to do great things in their lives.

The invited guests Chebrolu A.O –Ms.Sandhya Rani and Grama Panchayathi Secretary – I.Sivarama Krishna highlighted inspiring moments from the life of Swami Vivekananda.



Success Story: Chittymothu Vijaybabu is a Speaker in Bapuji Children's Parliament at Salapadu village in Chebrolu mandal organised by JMSSS. The National Inclusive Children's Parliament-2021 conducted elections for new committee from 23rd Jan 2021 to 31 Jan 2021 through Virtual Meet. In this Elections, from Andhra Pradesh Ch.Vijay Babu belonging to Selapadu got 3rd place. So, he elected as a **Prime Minister**, among two candidates such as Himanshu-Delhi and Priya-Punjab. Vijay been allotted for SDG-II Sustainable Cities & Communities portfolio. Hence it was encouragement to Children's Parliament to do effectively.



2. Empowerment of children and youngsters with disability

JMSSS community disability offers into the provision of services to individuals with disabilities by collaborating, linking and creating platforms to be a responsible and empathetic community member.

Accomplishments:-

1. On 11th April 2020, according to W.H.O guidelines CHAI-LF conducted an awareness program with the support of K.Karunasri(child No.405) to show sanitary methods like Hand wash precautionary measures towards COVID-19 among the disabled children.



2. Grass Root Comic: On 20th May 2020, during COVID-19 K.Sailu (Child.No.545) attended Extra-curricular activity program and had done Creative Comics about the theme COVID-19. In the month of August, R.Suneetha(Child No. 277)has created a platform to put down their social issues and the solutions to resolve it.



3. During COVID-19 lock down period 6 Disabled Children were attended 3 months Skill Training from June to August, which was conducted by Don Bosco Tech which was collaborated by JMSSS. As soon as completed the course Susmitha achieved the Job as a Data Entry Operator in Crane APEX Solutions at Vengalaya Palem.



4. **Provisions Distribution:** On 12th May 2020, due to COVID-19 JMJ Social Service Society behalf of CHAI-LF with the contribution of 7 friends of 10th class from RCM high school in Patibandla, distributed the



Provisions for 20 Differently Abled Children. The seven friends packed 15 varieties of items. The family members of the Differently Abled Children felt very happy and showed their gratitude towards CHAI-LF for the support and help during LOCKDOWN period.

5. On 11th April 2020, Pallapu Vasu got the Sadaram certificate. His child no. is 402 and living in Nallapadu. CHAI-LF has applied previously for this certificate through online MEESEVA centre. And continuously trying for the Sadaram Certificates for remaining 6 members.



6. On 21st Sep 2020, CHAI-LF submitted a Memorandum in Spandana program for COVID-19 Advocacy at District Collectorate, Guntur. In this program A.P.Disabled Organized President Mr.Neela Joji Babu, Guntur District Disabled Organized President Mr. G.Adishesu participated.



7. Ketto is the fund raising link for Help Parent of Special Child with Physio Home Kit, to support for Physiotherapy Kit to continue services to 16 children with special needs of 7 Villages situated in 5 Mandals in Guntur District of Andhra Pradesh.



8. Under the Education strategy, 09 Youngsters with disability were mobilized, motivated by the Community Based Rehabilitators and were occupied having smart phones between the age group 14-23 to be trained in Communicative English through Whatsapp in the month of July 2020, the module of 900 English Conversations was prepared by JMJ and organize twice a week classes through ZOOM App on Tuesday and Friday. And then circulate the notes and give homework for the other days which is submitted by Thursday and Monday through whatsapp and we are planning to conduct as part of the follow up with an assessment at the end of 3 months which is helping the youngsters to equip their communicating skills in English, which is a barrier for the young Indians though they are literate highly. Hence, we JMJ decided to impart this knowledge on English with which they are able to respond in English simple way.



9. Covid-19 relief Provision's Kit by CHAI-LF

During Covid-19 pandemic period Govt. announced lockdown, at that time common people also faced lot of struggles for daily bread of the family. CHAI-LF distributed Covid-19 Relief provisions kit for 6 months to 12 Differently abled children from May 2020 to October 2020. This kit contains Rice, Thour dal, Oil packet, Sugar, Groundnuts, Raagi flour, wheat flour, cloths wash bars and bathing Soaps.



For 5 months from November 2020 to March 2021 provided provisions to 11 differently abled children and in January month distributed COVID-19 relief provisions kit for 50 members of disabled children.

10. World Differently Abled Day

On 3rd Dec 2020, JMJSST conducted 59th World Disabled Day at Z.P.H.School in Vengalayapalem. The chief guest of this program Mr.Murthy, Head Master of ZPH School, appreciated JMJSST's services doing for disabled children. He gave suggestions to children to get mental strength. In this program Sr.Denin, Director of JMJSST; Sr.Saritha, Financial manager of JMJSST; Mr.Balaraju, Trainer from DBTech and K.Nageswara rao, C.B.R.worker of CHAI-LF and 20 Differently abled children participated.



11. Disabled Certificates



JMJSST took initiative for giving Disabled Certificate for 4 members, due to get mainly pension and bus pass. For two children had to take to the Guntur Government Hospital to get the Certificates. There the Doctor has examined and issued the certificates. For another two children took them to Tenali Government Hospital and got the certificates after examined by the Doctor.

12. We Ring the bell

On 27th March 2021, JMJSST conducted 'We Ring the Bell' program for disabled children at Z.P.H.School in Vengalayapalem. This program will be conducted national wide all over 29 states. The main purpose of the program is 'All children are welcome to school including with a disability children'. 'Welcoming' is the specialty of the program, like all the students will ring the bells at a time. The chief guest District Disabled President Mr. Neela Joji Babu addressed that Govt. also should provide ramps and friendly toilets to every school for disabled children. In this program JMJSST director Sr.Denin, Co-director Sr.Jayaseela and C.B.R Worker K.Nageswara rao participated.



13. Maha Deeksha

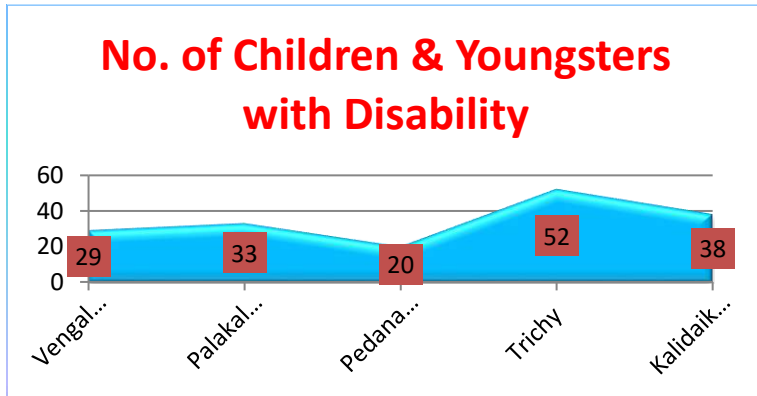

14. Bi cycles Distribution

On 10th April 2021, JMSSS sponsored Bi cycles for 2 disabled children Sk.Khajabi with disability OH-Loomotor and Sd.Jilani with disability Deaf & Dumb problem. They are living in Vengalayapalem village. They are studying 8th class in Z.P.H.School which is 2km faraway from their houses. Both the parents are working as daily wagers.



Success Story:



On 22nd June 2020, Mannava Susmitha is a youngster with disability of Locomotor(OH) of 82%. She is orthopedically handicapped of two legs. She is living in Vengalayapalem and studying Intermediate. JMSSS helping financially for education. To overcome the difficulties of transport to the college, JMSSS applied for Scooty Tri-wheeler, through online application. Under Financial Plan for Disabled Children, The State Government interviewed her and sanctioned 1lakh worth 'ACTIVA 5G Tri-Wheeler Scooty', freely. Susmitha and her family members felt very happy and showed their gratitude towards JMSSS and CHAI-LF.



And she joined BPO course for three months in DonBosco Skill Development which is collaborated with JMSSS. After completing the course she attended the interview for job. Then Susmitha got the job in the month of February as a Data Entry Operator in Crane APEX Solutions at Vengalaya Palem bi-pass road, Guntur (Dist.). Whenever joined she has drawn 5,500/- salary but after three months she is taking 7,000/- per month. She expressed gratitude towards JMSSS & CHAI-LF. And also she felt very happy for the scooty and explained that because of scooty she is able to do the job.



3. Mainstreaming the Orphan and Semi Orphan in the Nation building by providing Education and Medical Support

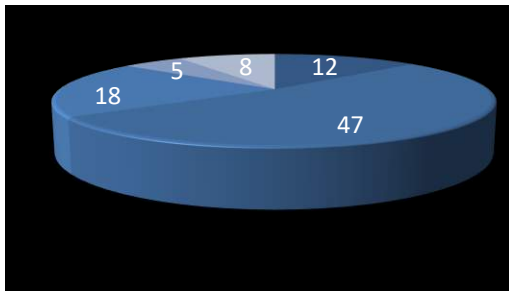
JMJSSS envisage providing an opportunity to be part of the nation as a self Knowledgeable and responsible children.

Accomplishments:-

On 23rd January 2021, JMJ Social Service Society conducted Meetho-Memu Program at JMJSSS, Nallapadu. In this program the grandeur celebrations of **Orphan Children's Birthdays**. This program presided over by Sr.Denin, Director of JMJSSS; and Sr.Jayasela, Co-Director of JMJSSS. The chief guests Rev.Sr.Clitus, JMJ Medico Socio Coordinator; Rev.C.Joshi, St.Joseph's convent superior; Ms.Suguna Rani, C.W.C. Chair Person; Mr.Dhanunjay & Mr.Syam, Rotary Club Members and Mr.Gopi, P.R.O. in



A.P.Secretariat; appreciated the services of JMJSSS and motivated the orphan children to reach high ends. In this program Orphan Children & their guardians, Community Coordinators and JMJSSS staff participated.



4. OBSERVANCE OF IMPORTANT DAYS

JMJSSS observed some issue of international and national concern to commemorate, promote and mobilize for action.

Accomplishments: -

International Water Day: On 22nd March, JMJSSS conducted International Water Day at Elementary School in Ambedkar Nagar. Head Master addressed that everyone should take care of using water. In this program 70 students participated.



International Women's Day: on 6th March JMJSST conducted International Women's Day at Nallapadu, JMJ Office. The Chief guests Disha Law Admin Mrs.Shanthi, Socialite and Advocate Kum.Anuradha, LTDS director Fr.Yesurathnam. Mrs.Shanthi addressed that Girls or women able to guess the attacks and immediately have to call 100, 112, 181 phone numbers. Kum.Anuradha gave awareness while talking friendly with every woman and encouraged them to grow in every aspect. In this program From MACTS 3 villages (Nambur, PedaKakani, Pedanandipadu), from JMJSST collaborated NGO LINSI 5 villages (Kakani, Perecharla, Uppalapadu, Nudurupadu & Nambur) and from LTDS-Bhadrachalam 30 women altogether 150 women participated.



Mahila March: In the months of Jan, Feb and March for 100 days, JMJSST conducted Mahila March campaign till March 8, 2021 in Nambur & Angalakuduru for giving awareness on protection teams and cybercrime for school & college students and women. The chief guests of the program women commission director Mrs.Suyaj and Disha Act Incharge Mrs.Shanthi addressed that women should be intelligent and brave to take a right decision at any circumstances. There are 420 students & women attended.



5. WOMEN INTEGRATED DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

JMJSST improves decision-making and skills of women in the villages to broaden business knowledge, global perspectives, and leadership insights to embrace transformation in their way of daily life.

Accomplishments: -



1. **Kitchen Garden** was encouraged by distributing the organic seeds and organic manure and 500 members grow the seeds.

2. **Achieved Employment through Women Empowerment Project (SAFP) ...**

In the month of September, JMJSST took initiative for supporting with employment in Leaf Plate Making Unit to (4 members) mother's of disabled children through Save a Family Project. During COVID-19 Pandemic situation these families are suffered a lot for daily bread. Because one is widow and two women are abandoned by their husbands and one is in below poverty. They felt very happy, expressed their gratitude towards JMJSST because of provided Employment during COVID-19 pandemic period.



3. **Advanced Tailoring Training & Distribution of Tailoring Machines:** JMJSST conducted 15 days training for women and also distributed the Advanced Tailoring Machine to them by



the chief guest Chandragiri Yesu Rathnam, honourable Market Yard Commissionar, Guntur.

Success Story:

My name is Jyothi, I am a tailor. My husband is a 4th class employee in a private sector. I have two children. In Lockdown period due to Covid-19 pandemic situation, we struggled a lot for daily bread. Then JMJS&S & Balavikasa gave 15 days training on Advanced Tailoring Machines and distributed the machine also. With this machine I am stitching masks and all varieties of ladies clothes. So, I am earning 8,000/- per month and able to eat 3 times a day. Hence, I am very thankful to JMJS&S & Balavikasa for the support and encouragement.



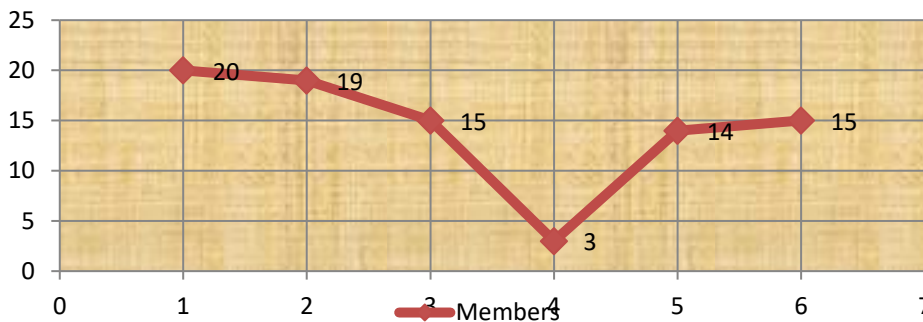
6. CARE FOR THE OLD AND DESTITUTE

JMJS&S cares for 80 older persons particularly in rural areas, who continue to suffer from psychological, economical problems leading to a miserable situation in old age.

Accomplishments: - Due to COVID-19 Pandemic period JMJS&S helped the Old & Destitute people with the provisions in two times in the months of September and December.

7. SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FOR YOUTH

JMJS&S are empowering youth with skill sets that make them more employable and productive in their work environment.

Accomplishments: -

- Due to COVID-19 pandemic in the lock down period Parent's Meet organized through Online Zoom meeting for Hospitality and BPO Domain in Accenture.

- On 12th Dec 2020, Guntur DB Tech Society Conducted Alumni Meet through Google Meet (Online). Ms.Radha Madhavi, one of our alumni presided over this Alumni meet program. This program has started with Prayer song and then welcome the guests and all the participants. Mr.Bala Raju E-Commerce Executive trainer, gave motivational speech and explained about Don Bosco tech Society organization



- Online orientations for the youth, meetings among the staff, and classes for the students have become an integral part of programme during this pandemic. It is also seen among the staff and the students of Don Bosco Tech Society. Online Placement Orientation has been held at Guntur Don Bosco society on 26th August 2020 for CRM DOMESTIC NON VOICE PHASE 10 BATCH 5. The meeting was mainly addressed on 'Work Readiness'. In total 25 trainees attended the online session. The key resource persons were Sr. Denin Mary - Centre head, Mr. Vinod Kumar – Placement coordinator AP& TS and Mr. Balaraju – Hospitality Trainer.

- Guest Lecture classes also conducted through Zoom online for Hospitality and BPO is part of the skill development program for every batch and a guest is invited from the respective sectors.

8. THE LEGAL AID CELL AT JMSS

A part time legal practitioner with 6 years of experience and with the support of senior advocates to address on average of 15 -20 cases per annum. Most of the cases are civil in nature, specifically matrimonial disputes(Domestic Violence, 498A, Divorce, Maintenance, widow's property rights etc.) a few land disputes, criminal and POCSO (prevention of Children from sexual offences-Child marriages prevention, Child sexual abuse, minor children) cases. Most of the cases are addressed free of cost or charging very nominal fees which covers court, documentation and travel expenses. Most of the matrimonial disputes are settled outside the court at JMSS-Legal Aid Cell by way of summoning both the parties & counseling. When the parties determine to go through the legal process, reference for the legal proceedings is made.

Accomplishments:

- People who approach us are poor, rural, illiterate, innocent and ignorant who cannot afford to bear the court & advocates fees. Some time people come to us at the end when everything is lost, at the hopeless situations. They are easily exploited by most of the advocates outside who charge high fees for their ends to be met. It is obvious that the lay advocates have chosen this profession for their livelihood where as when I look at this profession it is partaking in the Manifesto of Jesus 'to bring liberation to the captives' and 'to bring Justice for the poor and people in genuine need'.

9. VILLAGE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

JMJSSS adopted the backward tribal villages in Guntur and Ramachandrapuram where the rural development programs were not effectively implemented by the government machinery and to prepare a comprehensive Micro plan for Holistic development of tribal communities involving all stakeholders in a participatory mode to meet the needs of the village community.

Accomplishments: -

Leadership: Train the 35 VDC male and female monthly at the center by project Director and Field coordinator and capacitate in different mission topics.



Education: Sensitize on Child Friendly Environment-Hand Wash, nutritious meal, immunization, 63 children in Anganwadi center. They will be monitored by community organizer.



Household care: Community organizer and Field coordinator motivated 173 families to manage waste water by maintaining a kitchen garden.



Health Care: 173 families are motivated safe and clean toilets(doors, electricity, water)8 toilets constructed. And distributed COVID-19 health toolkit Sanitizations, Masks & Medical kit with immunity, vitamin tablets.

Earnings and Finances: 48 families are benefitted through income generation programme which is decided in the VDC.



Networking and Leveraging of Resources: Community organizer and 1 or 2 VDC members and with the help of Gram Volunteer follow up the 77 house applications eligible, covering street lights submitted in the panchayat.

SUCCESS STORY:

Tham living in Pedakakani, working as an Ear-Cleaner, charging Rs.30/- per person. He got married in early age and has 2 daughters, in a young age, has the responsibility to give daily bread to the family. Hardly he can earn Rs.120/- per day. Whenever he expressed to VDC and decided to support VDC amount with a small loan for the purchase of wires, to decorate the steering of the vehicles in a creative way. So, he can earn Rs.250/- per vehicle. He does 2 or 3 vehicles per day and able to pay Rs.300/- per month to VDC account. He is very happy to provide a better life to the family.



10. CAPACITY BUILDING TRAINING PROGRAM

A regional platform is developed through formation of cadre in South India of different stake holders for greater campaign, advocacy and lobbying towards sustainable leadership for emancipation of the marginalized communities through access to their rights and entitlements.

Accomplishments: -

On Aug 10th to 14th ISI training conducted by ISI cadre, Bangalore through online. In this online program . Mr.Ramanaiah and Dinakar explained about Panchayath Raj for 5 days. And Mr.Anjaneyulu, Society for Social Transformations, Kurnool advised that for village development should know about Panchayath Raj . And from 14th Dec 2020 to 18th Dec, ISI Bangalore Training Session held in Zoom online. Mr.Siva Sankar, Resource person trained on Social Animation Skills. JMJSSS coordinators participated in this program.

11. Life Circle, Sathenapalli: Holy Family Skill Development Centre which has created employment in the medical field in different parts of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana.

- Guest Lecturer: On 8th Jan 2021, was a enlightened day in the Dominion of DIALYSIS, our students have great opportunity to have an experienced, Dynamic leader of Micro biology, none other than the Rev. Sr. Glady Msc Nursing. She has spoken about the importance of the KIDNEYS and its components. Roles and Responsibilities of Dialysis Technician.



- Field Visit: On 15th Jan 2021, we have posted the students for the Field Visit for the clinical posting to the different laboratories for the clinical exposure to the students. This clinical posting helped the students so much and enlightened their knowledge.

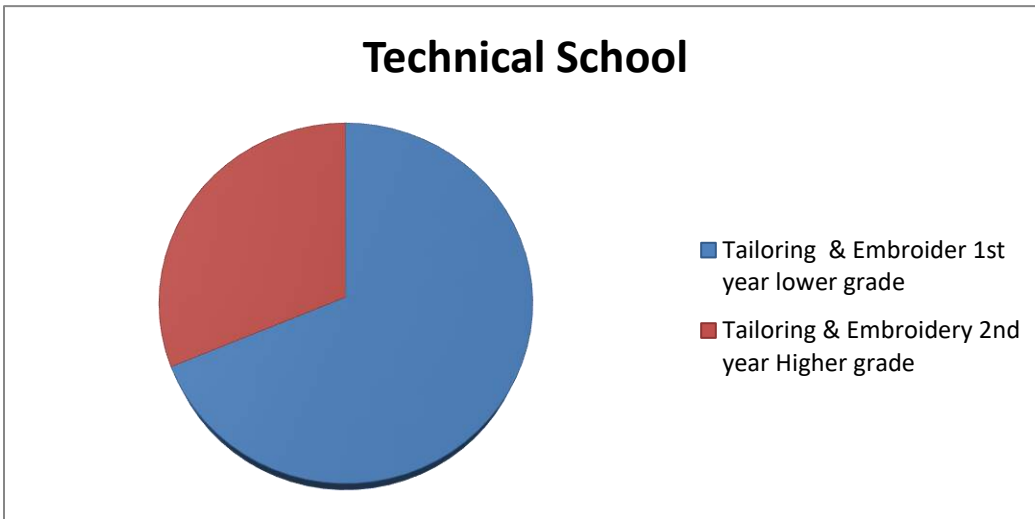
- Placements: Accommodation, Assessment and Certification by APSSDC. More over Placements in and around Guntur.



Reports from Zonal Units

1. St. Joseph's Technical School Training

Implementation of the activities are carried out according to the office of the Director of Government Examinations, AP under Technical Certificate course (TCC) Examinations which conducts exam of two papers covering-Drafting & Garment Making(Leg Garments)-100marks and Drafting & Garment Making(Body Garments)-100marks. There are 20 members attending the training.



2. JMJ UJJWALA HOME FOR THE TRAFFICKED WOMEN

JMJSSS is part of a Comprehensive Scheme for Prevention of Trafficking and Rescue, Rehabilitation, Re-integration and Repatriation of Victims of Trafficking for Commercial Sexual Exploitation.

Accomplishments: -

- **Skill training** is given for future sustainability. This year given on Candle Making, Surf Making, Phenyl and every year Dye and Printing, Jute bags and Paper plate making.

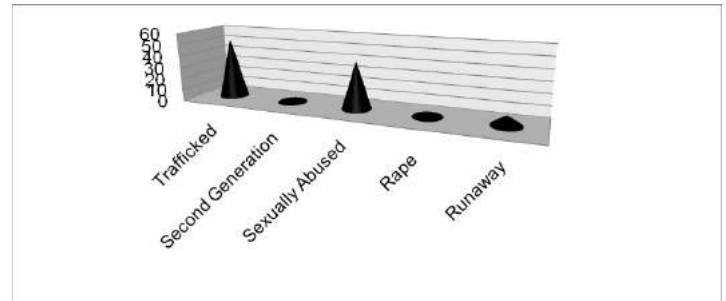


- **Tours & Picnics:** Inmates were taken to outdoor for picnic.

Success story:

I am Mariamma, I came to UJJAWAL HOME from Chennai. My Native place Guntur. When I was small, left the house and landed in trafficking in business. Joined with trafficked family and I was living as a member of that family. I got ration and Aadhar card maintaining relationship as a family member. I was going place to place for this type of work and earned and gave benefit to the same family. Mean while I got into all bad habits i.e. drinking, smoking and drug addicts. Started this type of work at the age of 18 and continued same work, until I was caught by the police in Chennai.

From Chennai I was brought to UJJAWALA home through women and Child welfare department. Living in UJJAWALA gave me a new outlook and it influenced me totally to change my way of life. In the beginning seeing my agony they provided GUTKA for few days. Gradually through their counseling and guidance made to realize and change my total life. Few months as inmate of UJJAWALA I went for the work. Through friends I found life partner and settled my life. I learned skills in sales and purchases. Vocational exposure provided me for the family monitory sustainability.

3. JMJ SWADHAR HOME FOR WOMEN IN DIFFICULT CIRCUMSTANCES

A Scheme for Rescue of Victims of Trafficking and Women in Difficult Circumstances like widows deserted by family, survivors of natural disaster, victims of domestic violence, victims of trafficking, released from jail etc.”

Accomplishments: -

- **Birth Day Celebrations** of the customs for the inmates which will help the inmates feel home environment.
 - On line classes in Skill training is given to all the inmates present here.

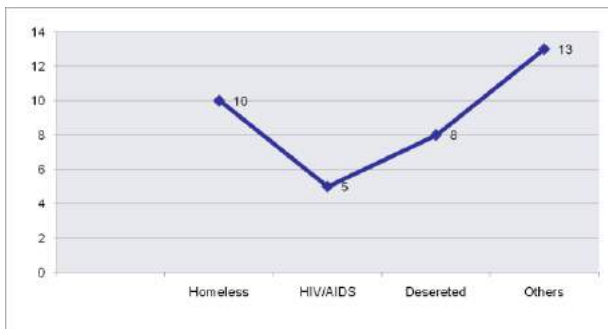


- Girl Child Day: Conducted Girl Child Day and given Formal education is encouraged once in a week to bring out their hidden talents and to channelize their emotional energies.



Success Story:

- My name is Sai Priyanka. My father's name is Srinivas Rao. I am twenty one years old. I am from Narsaro Pet, Guntur (DT). When I was 10 years old I lost my father. When I was fifteen years old I got married. For few months I have happily led my life and as the days pass on I was torched physically and mentally so could not bear with that so I ran away from my husband. I informed my mother. And she joined me in Swadhar home. Since then I was staying in Swadhar and happily leading my life. I am trained in all the skill training works like tailoring, stretching, making fiber bags and thread bangles etc. Sisters also taught me how to speak and to lead my life. After coming to Swadhar I have completed my Inter and Certificate courses which will help me to live a dignified life. When I came to Swadhar I was too stubborn and there were times where I have used very harsh words to my peer group and to the management. But the sisters through their counseling they gave me lots of hope and encouragement in my life. My mother and my grandmother had a confidence in me. They have arranged marriage for me. I am really happy, because Swadhar sisters helped me a lot in my life and helped me to stand on my feet and face the society courageously. I am always indebted to the sisters and to the Swadhar home.



4. PRAJWALA OPEN SHELTER HOME

PRAJWALA help individuals recognize their inner potentials and celebrate life by developing their self-worth. The path chosen for this is equipping the participants to deal with their emotional, cognitive, aesthetic and spiritual dimensions of life. This is achieved through counseling, training, conscientizing and empowering.

Accomplishments: -



Skill Training Programs: The Inmates were trained in Tailoring and Craft work.

• **Daily Activities:** Daily yoga and meditation and Art of Living for concentration. Everyday indoor and outdoor games, Regular group and individual counseling and Informal education, Gardening, Filed work and Prayer.

V.Devi (26yrs) she is married woman. She has three children. She had divorce with her husband and living with her mother, brothers and sisters, in Indrapalem nearby Kakinada. Due to some family problems she came to Vijayawada. With the help of some good people she went to railway police. They brought her to Prajwala JMJ Swadhar Home, Hanuman junction through DW&CDA. She stayed here nearly three years. Whenever APD Madam comes for visit, Devi used to asking her to send to her village. Here she learned Tailoring and Household works. She is very quiet. One fine day she got permission to go to another Home which is near to her home town. We went and joined her in Rajamahendravaram. After few days we heard that her sister came and recognized & took her to their home. Now she is very happy.



5. PRAJWALA CHILD CARE INSTITUTE (CCI)

Accomplishments: -



On 30th October 2020 was a day of appreciation and delightful for all our JMJ Sisters who have had extended their yeomen services for all the inmates a Prajwala. This centre began on the same day in the year 2010 in very small way. The celebration began with the Holy Eucharist presided over by the Vicar General of the Vijayawada diocese



Rev.Fr.Muvvala Prasad with concelebrant Rev.Fr.Melchior the parish priest of Ranigarithota, who entreated God's choicest blessings upon the gathering. Sr.Jaysheela in her well prepared introductory words briefed the gathering with the bird's eye view of the history, vision, mission, purpose and the various activities.

6. JMJ HOME FOR THE AGED, DURGI

It is initiated mainly to care the poor and deserving aged people. All the needs of this home are met by our Provincialate. Local benefactors occasionally contribute paddy, provide food for the inmates. They are also helping the lepers who reside in a nearby colony. Once a month they visit them, if necessary give them medical care and solve problems like water, repairs etc.

Accomplishments:

The main apostolate of St. Ignatius Convent Durgii is caring for the aged and doing Evangelization. The main motto of the starting of the Home for the aged is to take care of the economically poor and needy. All the maintenance for the inmates is met by the Provincialate. And also local benefactors contribute on the special occasions such as paddy, clothes and food.

We provide all the facilities and take care of them as small kids. We provide the nutritive food to keep them



healthy. We also give them the monthly required cosmetics such as soaps, oil, paste, brush...etc. We arrange Dhobi to wash their clothes. We have a dedicated Nurse Sister who is in charge of the home for the aged. If they are sick the immediate care is given and takes them to the nearby private hospital. Regular medicine is provided to the sick

people.

In the home we provide them necessary furniture to sit and relax. They even play indoor games and regularly watch the TV and relax. We have a big campus with variety of plants and flowers. They do even admire at the nature. We have regular prayers to strengthen them spiritually. We take care of the individual general hygiene. Some of the inmates help in doing vegetable cutting flocking the flowers.



From the time they joined in the Home for the Aged if they remain till their death we take care of them even in doing their funeral rights. Inmates are very happy and are ever faithful to the service of the sisters.



7. JMJ SSS Nilayam, Kondramutla

Providing hostel for SC, ST & BC girls at present 110 tribal students are accommodated in the hostel for children of LKG to 5th standard.

taking care of their health Taking extra care for those who are unable to read and write and to speak with others.



Success Story:

Trisha Bai hails from Errabalem, Vinukonda and belongs to tribal family. Parents were uneducated they go for work in different places and they come back once in three months. She has one younger brother. From 1st class onwards she studied in our RCM Government school & Stayed in our JMJ Hostel. Because of Financial crisis for one year she discontinued her studies. Later with some good men's help she joined in JMJ hostel, Kondramtla. She successfully completed her 4th standard. Her family is in very pathetic condition, it's very difficult even to get the daily wages. She is even unable to buy her books, stationary items etc. We are encouraging her to pursue what she wishes of her life. She was happy and grateful to donors from the JMJ Provincialate project which she could finish her 4th class. Her family members were very happy by seeing their child could study well. Now her desire is to continue her studies. She passed in Gurukula entrance exam and got the seat for the free Education. Now the child has left the home and studying in Gurukula Patashala at Narsaraopet till she will be continuing her 10th Class under Social Welfare Department. We want to extend our helping hand as she needs our help in future.

RESHMA: Reshma 22 years old is having disability of Hydro cephalous and MR. She has got both parents. Her father left her when he saw the condition of this child. Her mother and grandmother are taking care of this child. We conducted reshma grandmother and enquired about her. They were also searching her. Suddenly her mother appeared with a baby after leaving reshma; her mother loved a boy and married him. She did not want to tell her husband's family about reshma. After leaving reshma she never came to see her. Now reshma staying with us past 10 years. She unable to walk without any support. Now she is very improving by herself. We are providing Physiotherapy for reshma to improving walking.



2. Empowerment of Children And Youngsters With Disability, Kallidaikurichi

Accomplishments: -

Since it was lockdown due to the corona we could not go to their houses. In spite of lockdown the Physio doctor could teach the physio exercise to their mothers through the WhatsApp. Those who couldn't afford a smartphone,

we visited their houses following Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) of Corona protocol. The mothers were not cooperative to do the exercise. In spite of that we motivated them to teach their children. The mothers were doing the exercise and teaching their children as well. We have documented the teaching of the parents and have shared it with CHAI

As JMJ SSS in Kallidaikurichi is in the nascent stage we are trying to do our best to reach out to the poor in need. During the lock-down period we supported the poor families with provisions and food for the homeless and widows. Further, through CHAI we got food kit. We distributed them to the families of Different able children. We also gave awareness about the Covid-19 pandemic to their parents and their neighbors.

The parents may not compare them with the other children. Each child was born in a unique way. Especially the differently able children are born for a special purpose. We need to share a special love for them. We need to modify ourselves according to the need of the child. The disability law will bring long-awaited hope and change to the lives.



Lawyer Ambai, spoke about the various government schemes that are available for these special Children. The highlight of his talk was as to how to take care of these special children. He was appreciating the sisters for their work specially going beyond all religions. After that all our children gave a cultural program to our guest. The guest was happy and were happy to see the especially talented children.

Further we got food kit for our children through VRO. We bought Rice, Dhal, Grains, Sugar and oil, worth Rs.1000

For persons with disabilities and many others too, it is not enough to be merely independent, but it is also necessary to have a group that supports and provides an empathetic relationship. Such a group acts as a forum to meet, to discuss and to represent their interests and needs to the outside world. Now that the state administration has begun to recognize the special needs of disabled people, such a group can also work collectively to seek the support services from those in authority, more as a right than a benefit, to improve on their existing situation. Organising people in self help groups serves different purposes, depending on the situation and the need. Such a forum can help people to be visible members in the larger community. Members can support one another through sharing information on referral services and other available resources, help make decisions on family and individual matters etc. Self help groups with the support of other such groups, can advocate jointly to obtain services, aids and equipment, and for integration in the larger community.

On 22/09/2020 JMJ community Care Centre has conducted the Mehendi programme for the Disables young youth. Though it is pandemic we the staffs have decided to have Mehendi programme for all the disabled children and encourage the children for their skills. Since it was pandemic we have invited less children around 20 children. Mis.Sahin Parbin was the resource person for the programme. She has motivated all the children to participate in the programme; she too joined along with the children. Children were very enthusiastic to learn and to show their talent. They showed their talents that they too can do everything. After the programme we have provided food for the children. After the food we all have dispose to their own destiny.



3. International Disability day Celebration -2020

On 3rd December is observed as World Disability day. Each year the UN announces a theme to observe for International Day of people with disability. The theme of 2020 is “Building Back Better: toward a disability- inclusive accessible and sustainable post-COVID-19 World”.



On this day JMJ CCC celebrated the disability day. Due to COVID-19 we had small gathering. Mrs. Nira Manjula Kujur has welcomed the gathering and explained the importance of the gathering and the Disability day celebration.

After that we have conducted 3 games for the disabled children. They were so enthusiastic to play the game. Parents all were happy that after long time all the children came together and enjoyed through the game.

Last but not the least, we have distributed prizes for the winner children and distributed Horlics for all the children. Our programme came to an end with a small action song dance by everyone.

4. Games and Sports For Disabled Children.

On 3rd December as we have observed the Disability day, we have decided to conduct the game for the disabled children. It is important sports and games for all the physically challenged children to build self confidence and creating something better world for them. We have conducted 3 games for the children that are Arrow game, balloon and other games. They were very happy to participate in the programme.

Finally we distributed prizes for the winner children gifts and sweets for the children and for the parents. Everyone co operated to make this day a joyful one.



5. Online English classes for Disabled children

Online classes enhances more comfortable learning environment to the children. It gives student the opportunity to plan and study time around the rest of their day. Due to COVID -19 since children are not able to go to school or colleges, we have decided to conduct online classes for disabled children. We have taken spoken English classes for the children those who are able to learn the English. We have taken time to prepare simple spoken English for the differently able children.

6. Tailoring programme

Tailoring programme for the women those who are at home and for the differently able children who are able to learn .We have encourage them to learn the tailoring for the 3 months. These women are from different villages, we visit them every week and encourage them the in tailoring.



In their part they too have attended all the classes and showed their interest to learn the basic stitching. Some of them they have kept tailoring machine and started their own business.

7. FORMATION OF SHG GROUP:

The people of disabilities are the most vulnerable person and are not given dignity even inside the family. SHG programme for the disabled



improving their livelihood support to create and enhance their quality of life to live life with dignity and self confidence in this pandemic. Our CBR workers are encouraging them to keep monthly meeting and regular deposit. There are two groups namely 1. Annapurna SHG group, 2. Saikrishna SHG group. In those two groups only four of our disabled children are there. At present they are doing farming, rice business. All are interested in their business and saving some amount in the bank.

8. PHYSIOTHERAPY

The role of physiotherapy is to support people with disability. Physiotherapy uses evidence based techniques to improve a person's health and wellbeing. We have send five of our children for treatment at Sambalpur , Mr subrat he has gone through the individually & suggested some of the exercise to practice daily at home morning & evening by the assistances of parents , which will help the child to improve and develop the muscles strength to feel better physically to do their own works by themselves .



9. SKILL SEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

JMJ CCC has collaborating with Don Bosco Tech India. That's call "Skill Development Program" under the "Swarnajayanti Gram Swarojgar Yojana (SGSY)" Scheme for the rural BPL youths of the country. It is implemented to market-driven vocational training for the economically and socially marginalized youth. We are training the youth in different domains like Hospitality, Sales & Marketing, and Hotel management. Due to COVID-19 students are having classes in online. This project is for the development of the youth who are dropout in their studies and those who are jobless.

10. HOME VISIT:

Visiting the family is part of our responsibilities, giving counselling and strengthening their family life. They feel comfortable & happy. We visit the family of disabled children but this year because of COVID-19 pandemic we were not regular in visiting the family. Some of the families we have visited.

Kiran Kumar Rana hails from Katarbaga Sambalpur District. He comes from a poor family both the parents are coolie worker. He lives with his family, and the family members are very supportive. He is a locomotors disability and he was diagnosis is KYPHOSCOLIOSIS RIGHT. He wants to continue his studies He has completed his +3 and had done PGDC course. Now at present he has established his own computer centre and wants to establish one book store. With great interests he continues his studies. With the financial support of CHAI-LF he completed his +3. And now he is working in his own. He renders his special thanks to JMJ CHAI- LF who is a great support for his success.
